CDC grant-funded strategies

- Enhance Cancer Registries data quality, completeness, use, and dissemination
- Use surveillance systems and population-based surveys to assess cancer burden and inform programmatic efforts
- Support partnerships for cancer control and prevention
- Deliver screening and implement evidenced-based interventions (EBIs)
- Conduct program monitoring and evaluation

CT-specific strategies

Primary prevention

Promoting HPV education and vaccination

Screening

Promoting comprehensive lung cancer screening programs across the state

Promoting colorectal cancer screenings at age 45

Survivorship

Educating caregivers and survivors on factors that improve quality of life for cancer survivors

Health care access and quality

Analyzing surveillance data to identify ways to improve health care access and quality

Reducing barriers to screening and care through the use of community health workers.
